



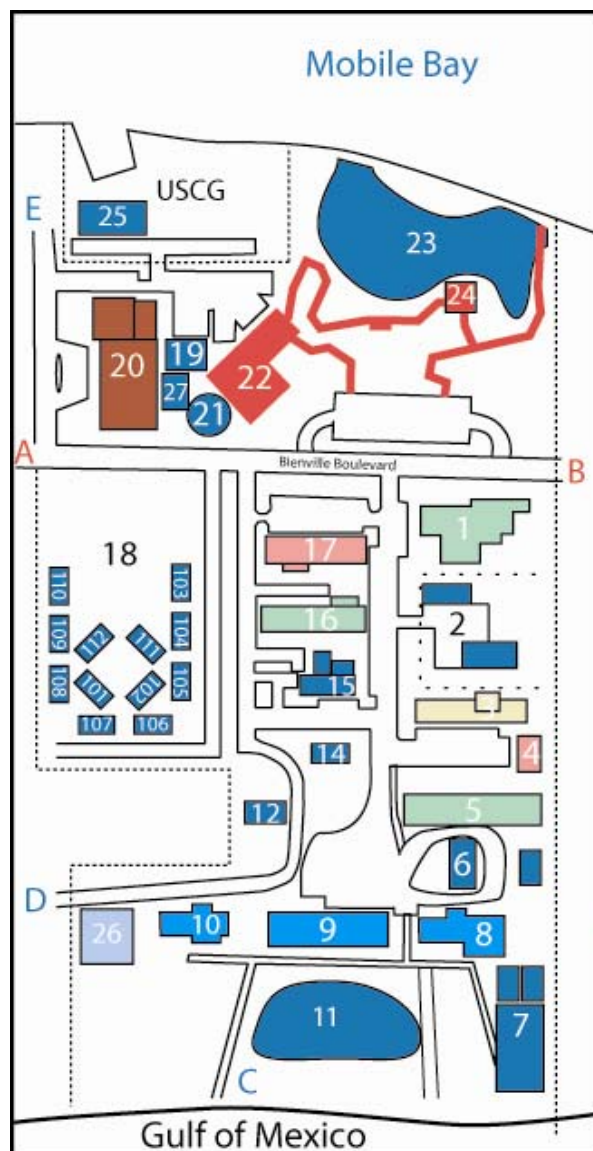
## DIRECTIONS TO THE DAUPHIN ISLAND SEA LAB FOR OCEANS ALIVE

Directions to the Dauphin Island Sea Lab - Endeavor Hall: Take I-65 south to I-10 West, exit on 17-A. This is highway 193, leading through an industrial area. After two red lights, railroad tracks and a bridge, you will come to a 3-way stop, go left at the stop sign. You will then come to a 4-way stop sign, go right. Highway 193 resumes and continues all the way to Dauphin Island. Once you arrive on the island, you will come to a 3-way stop sign, go left. Travel approx 2.5 miles passing boat ramps on the left and a campground on the right, look for a street on the right named "Agassiz" go to the next driveway on the right and turn into the Sea Lab campus. Drive toward the three brightly colored (blue, pink & green), elevated buildings. Just before those buildings, look for a green/teal building on the left with a large wooden deck. This is Endeavor Hall, the classroom you will be using.
